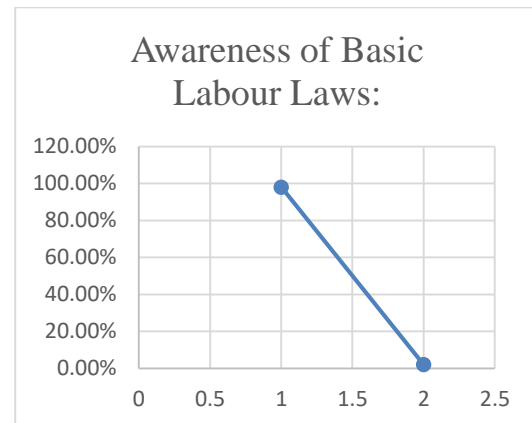

An overwhelming 98% of respondents are aware of the basic labor laws applicable to their organization.

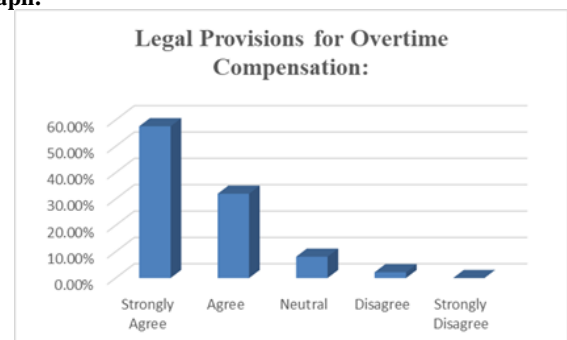
Only 3.1% are not aware.
